## Merrimack Valley Credit Union Pledges \$50,000 to Support Literacy Program at Lawrence Public Library

Grant will enable library to hire part-time literacy coordinator to lead program

**Lawrence, Mass**. (February 24, 2020) – With thousands of residents waiting for spots in English as a Second Language and adult education classes, Merrimack Valley Credit Union has pledged \$50,000 to support the Lawrence Public Library to develop a comprehensive literacy program for all ages. With these funds, the Lawrence Public Library plans to hire a part-time Literacy Coordinator to build on its existing literacy programs and to develop specific classes that meet the community's needs from elementary school through adult education.

"We are committed to supporting the communities we serve in every way possible, and this grant allows us to help address a growing need in Lawrence," said John Howard, President & CEO, Merrimack Valley Credit Union. "We are proud to partner with the Lawrence Public Library, a trusted community resource that thousands of residents turn to for further education and knowledge. Our team members look forward to growing our partnership and to supporting the development and growth of the new programs."

In 2015, the City convened more than 12 adult education community organizations and determined more than 2,000 residents were waiting for spots in English as a Second Language (ESL) courses or adult education classes. Despite advocating for additional funding, community organizations continue to report long waiting lists. According to the 2010 U.S. Census, more than 30 percent of Lawrence residents have not graduated from high school; of that portion, 20 percent achieved less than a ninth-grade education level

"From our daily conversations with residents and other community organizations, we know there is a huge need for literacy programs in Lawrence that can help people of all ages," said Jessica Vilas Novas, Director, Lawrence Public Library. "In fact, reading tutoring is one of the most requested services from parents. With the generous grant from Merrimack Valley Credit Union, we are now able to enhance our current literacy programs and develop new ones to help children, teens and adults."

As one piece of the literacy program, Merrimack Valley Credit Union, one of the 10 largest credit unions in Massachusetts, will host financial literacy workshops on a wide variety of topics, including budgeting and saving, understanding credit, buying a car and planning for retirement. Each session will be held at the main library location on the last Saturday of each month at 10:00 a.m. in Spanish and 11:00 a.m. in English. The next session, focused on understanding credit scores and credit reports, will be held on Saturday, February 29. Currently, the Lawrence Public Library partners with the Adult Learning Center to offer Citizenship classes for 15 students. The Library also hosts two conversation circles, one in English and the other in Spanish, where community members can practice their language skills together. Children up to sixth grade can also receive one-on-one tutoring for reading. The Library plans to expand these offerings under the new Literacy Coordinator.
