# Merrimack Valley Credit Union and Bridgewater Credit Union **Surprise Community Members with Random Acts of Kindness**

Credit unions spent nearly \$6,000 to perform good deeds for community members

Lawrence, Mass. (September 24, 2019) – Over the course of one week in September, employees from Merrimack Valley Credit Union (MVCU) and Bridgewater Credit Union (BCU), a division of MVCU, surprised community members in both regions with random acts of kindness. The credit unions spent nearly \$6,000 performing good deeds for strangers, including picking up the tab for breakfast, groceries and student lunch debt, providing lunch for first responders, and treating school teachers, nonprofits, senior living facilities and daycares to gifts and sweets. Together, more than 40 MVCU and BCU employees logged nearly 50 hours impacting hundreds of community members.

"Everyone at Merrimack Valley Credit Union values being part of caring and vibrant communities," said John Howard, President & CEO of Merrimack Valley Credit Union. "That's why we dedicated a week of our time to helping our fellow community members with random acts of kindness. We aim to give as much back to the communities as we gain; this is just one of the many ways we do just that."

Bridgewater Credit Union and Merrimack Valley Credit Union employees spent several weeks brainstorming activities and ways to help surprise members of their communities with random acts of kindness. The group engaged a wide variety of organizations in many locations throughout both regions.
